Satellite Bay Camp Closure Notification

Aug.27, 2018

Mr. Lloyd Gruben.

This is to advise you that as of August 22, 2018, the camp at Satellite Bay is winterized and closed for the season. The camp and land use activities at Satellite Bay are associated with the Inuvialuit Water Board (IWB) issued Water Licence #N5L8-1837.

As previously communicated, due to deteriorating weather and airstrip conditions, the decision was made to postpone the remaining construction work to 2019. Unfavourable weather conditions on the island critically limited the number of flights affecting fuel supplies and the safe transport of personnel to Satellite Bay. By August 22, 2018 the low fuel reserves and deteriorating weather resulted in the need to prioritize the safe demobilization of the crew from Satellite Bay.

The need to safely transport staff from Satellite Bay resulted in the necessity to leave, at Satellite Bay, a total of eight (8) used fuel drums which were filled by pumping melt water from the fuel storage berms, equipment drip trays and tent heater berms. Since the drums may have contained fuel residues the water is being treated as the hazardous "oily waste water". The drums were labelled and secured for the winter in secondary containment. In 2019, the waste will be disposed at an approved facility in accordance with the project's Inuvialuit Water Board approved Waste Management Plan.
