## **Tuk Base Remediation Project, Tuktoyaktuk, Northwest Territories**

The ILA received the electronic reports attached to your email on the project mentioned above, and as submitted by Imperial/Golder's comprising:

Project Description-Tuk Base Remediation

Tuk Base Waste Management Plan

Tuk Base Erosion and Sediment Control Plan

Reclamation Closure and Monitoring Plan- Tuk Base

Tuk Base- Dock Repair Removal and Monitoring Plan

Tuk Base- Remedial Action Plan, and

that ILA intends to re-purpose of the North Dock facility after remediation, repair, and stability of the shoreline from erosion.

Imperial/ Golder submitted the proposed Tuk Base Remediation Project to the appropriate regulatory organization including the Inuvialuit Land Administration (ILA) for approval and authorization before the commencement of the remediation project.

The application process is as stipulated in Section 11 of the Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA) through our Land Use Application System. In the IFA, sections 7(13) and (85-91), that indicated the general access to and across Inuvialuit lands, and the water management guidelines, including coastal shoreline.

The Reclamation, Closure and Monitoring Plan- Tuk Base- Regulatory Background, section 2.2, Project Description-Tuk Base, section 4.2, and the Tuk Base- Dock Repair Removal and Monitoring Plan, introduction, section 1.0, indicated that the proponent would obtain additional authorization from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) before proceeding on the shoreline remediation, dock repair, and erosion control works.

The ILA is considering the application and awaiting the submission of the regulatory authorization from the DFO by Imperial/ Golder. Consequently, ILA will issue the Land Use Permit with appropriate terms and condition for the remediation project as guided by the IFA within the Inuvialuit Land.
