Re: N7L1-1836 – Imperial Oil – BAR-C/Tununuk Point – Renewal of Type B Water Licence

The Inuvialuit Water Board (IWB) is pleased to approve the renewal of Water Licence N7L1-1836 for the Phase II Post-Construction Site Monitoring, removal of the remaining dock sheet piles, site maintenance and reporting activities. In this regard, all conditions for N7L1-1836 will remain as originally issued on March 31, 2014 and amended on January 30, 2017 with the following revisions and additions:

1. the expiry date to June 30, 2040;
2. Part B: General Conditions, Item 18;
3. Part C: Conditions Applying to Construction, Items 8, 9, 10, 11, 12; and
4. Part E: Conditions Applying to Waste Management and Disposal, Items 11, 12.

Each of these are detailed in the attached water licence renewal.

Please note that the updated Monitoring Plan, Spill Contingency Plan, and Erosion, Sediment and Drainage Control Plan are approved by the Board as submitted. A copy of the renewed Terms and Conditions and all documents associated with the licence renewal, including comments received from external parties, has been filed in the IWB Public Register. Copies are available at the IWB Office and on the IWB electronic register located on the IWB website: www.inuvwb.ca.

The IWB appreciates the cooperation of Imperial Oil Resources in complying with the Terms and Conditions of the Water Licence. As required by section 4 of the *Waters Act*, the applicant must comply with all other legislation pertinent to the activities authorized under this licence. INUVALUIT WATER BOARD LICENCE RENEWAL

Licensee	Imperial Oil Resources
Licence Number	N7L1-1836
Effective Date of Renewal	July 1, 2020

Pursuant to the *Waters Act* and Waters Regulations the Inuvialuit Water Board hereby grants the following Licence Renewal.

All N7L1-1836 licence conditions will remain as originally issued on March 31, 2014 and amended on January 31, 2017 and also include the following terms and conditions.

Term of Water Licence

The current expiry date is June 30, 2040 to ensure completion of the Phase II Post-Construction Site Monitoring Program, remaining dock sheet pile removal activities and maintenance and reporting activities.

Part B: General Conditions

18. The Licensee shall submit to the Board the final bounding coordinates or geospatial data for the proposed and completed project footprint.

Part C: Conditions Applying to Construction

8. A Dock Sheet Pile Removal Plan shall be submitted to the Inuvialuit Water Board (IWB) for Board approval at least thirty (30) days prior to conducting any remaining dock sheet pile removal activities including but not limited to:
 - a) Removal schedule, number/quantity, removal method/procedure, associated shoreline erosion mitigation measures;
 - b) Names, addresses and functions of contractors and sub-contractors; and
 - c) Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) Decision letter shall be submitted to the IWB prior to conducting any activities, including removal of remaining dock sheet piles.
9. All fuel or storage vessels containing hazardous substances left for extended periods of time (including overnight in vehicles), should be stationed in an area that contains sufficient secondary containment (i.e. drip pans, lined bermed areas, double walled enviro-tanks etc.).
10. Personnel shall be trained to ensure that any unauthorized discharge is contained and remediated to the satisfaction of the inspector. In case refuelling takes place near water, in-water spill planning shall be considered to prevent inadvertent releases.
11. All heavy equipment and refuelling vehicles must carry portable spill kits that include items such as absorbent pads, containment booms, and spill pool catchment receptacles.


12. The Licensee shall reassess the landfill areas and implement the mitigation measures to avoid further progression of cracking to the satisfaction of the inspector.

Part E: Conditions Applying to Waste Management and Disposal


11. A copy of third-party agreement(s) or letters between the licensee (Imperial Oil) and third parties to store, transport or dispose of wastes (domestic garbage, metallic, sewage, hazardous, etc.) generated during the removal of the dock sheet piles, the Phase II Post-Construction Site Monitoring and maintenance activities at least thirty (30) days prior to conducting such activities including:
 - a) type and quantities of waste and disposal location(s); and
 - b) proof of acceptance from third parties.
12. If using or generating hazardous waste, the Licensee shall register as a Generator of Hazardous Waste in the NWT and track the disposal of hazardous waste from the site activities to registered receivers on Hazardous Waste Movement documents provided by ENR. The Licensee shall contact the ENR Environment Division to register or for more information contact the Hazardous Waste Management Specialist, Environmental Protection and Waste Management Division at (867) 767- 9236 extension 53187.

This Licence is renewed and recorded at Inuvik, Northwest Territories.
