



INUVALUIT WATER BOARD VISITS PAULATUK WATER/WASTE FACILITIES

The Inuvialuit Water Board (IWB) had the opportunity to visit the Hamlet of Paulatuk on August 11, 2015. The IWB members and staff, along with the Environment and Natural Resources Water Resources Officer (WRO) viewed the municipal facilities licensed through the Type B Water Licence: the Water Treatment Plant and freshwater lake, the Solid Waste Disposal Facility, the Sewage Lagoon and the water/waste delivery vehicles. The WRO was also able to collect samples from the freshwater lake and the effluent from the sewage lagoon. The IWB and WRO also met the Hamlet Mayor and Council and staff to discuss issues with regard to the licensing process, non compliance issues and the renewal of the Paulatuk Municipal Water Licence.

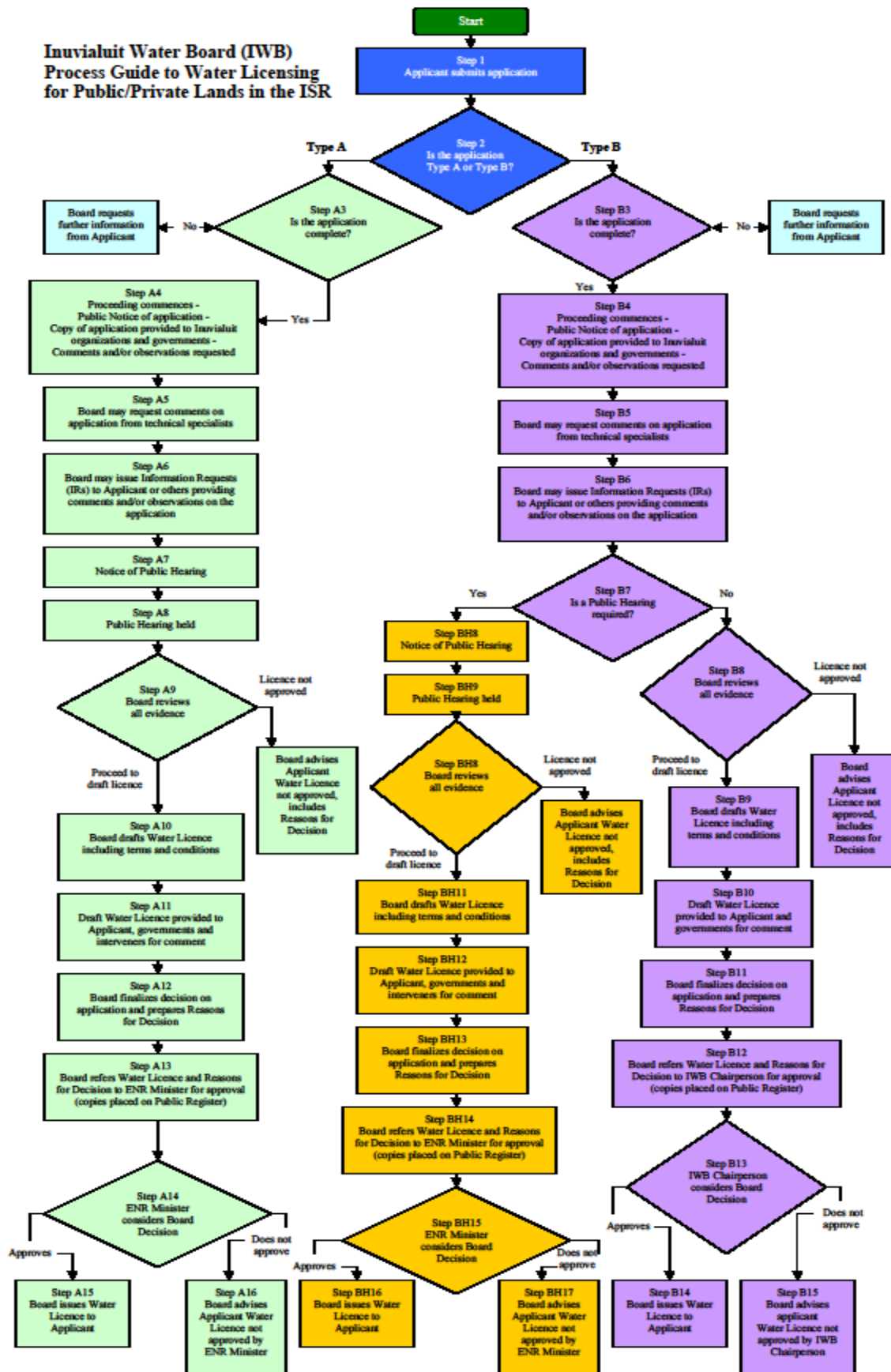

Visit to Ulukhaktok

Inuvialuit Water Board Staff had the opportunity to visit another Inuvialuit Settlement Region community. On August 18, 2015 Dr. Bijaya Adhikari, Science and Regulatory Coordinator, accompanied Philippe Thibert-Leduc, ENR Water Resources Officer to Ulukhaktok to meet with Hamlet Staff and visit the Water Intake, Solid Waste and Sewage Disposal Facilities. They were also able to collect water samples as part of the Surveillance Network Program (SNP), which is a component of all water licences.

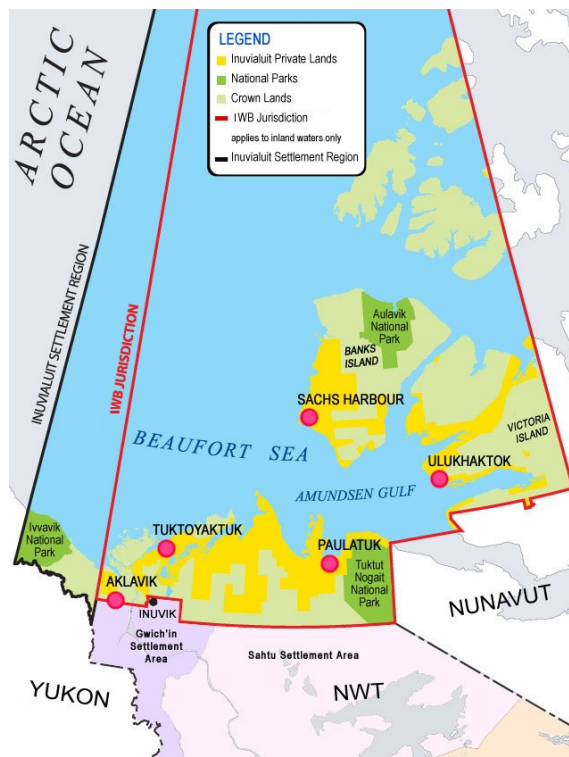
